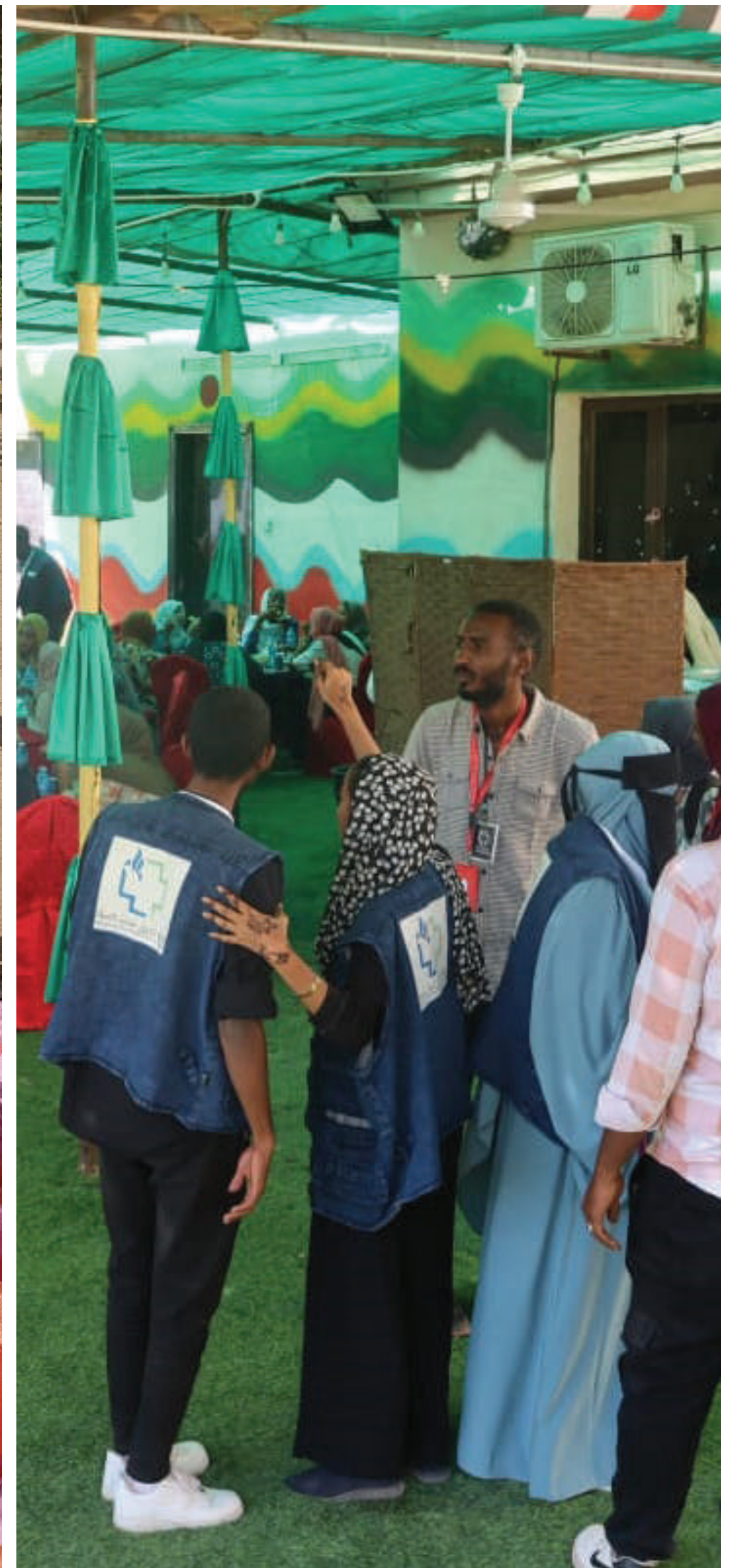


EDITORIAL

Since the inception of the Localization Coordination Council “LCC”, with its four components (emergency rooms in the different states, technical committees of the rooms, national organizations and international organizations), the common concern of the council has been to contribute to alleviating the humanitarian situation caused by the cursed war that broke out in Sudan on April 15, 2023. In this context, the Council achieved a significant and effective contribution to the affected people, represented in many activities that were implemented on the ground, such as providing water, food, shelter, and services: Providing water, food, shelter, medical services, protection and evacuation, the realization of these services reflected significantly on the lives of people, especially children and women. Various events such as workshops, seminars, forums and sports activities were organized, women’s chambers and volunteer funds were established, in addition to effective contributions to the entry and distribution of international relief supplies, and volunteers decorated social media pages with images of solidarity and solidarity, provided the media with reliable news, and issued the first issue of the Asdaa Solidarity Bulletin, and worked hard and dedicated to plant the seeds of solidarity aid and water them with effort, sweat, sleep and blood! The work and provision of services was carried out in the midst of extremely complex security conditions, under artillery shelling and bullet showers, and through checkpoints and the risks of arrests and human rights violations.

Despite all these challenges, risks, and psychological and physical exhaustion, the members of the emergency rooms did not falter, and they continued to work bravely and valiantly, facing death over their heads until we lost an estimated number of our best young men and women, and we ask God for their pure souls.

Distributing food baskets to 450 families in Zalingei

South Darfur State Health Strengthening Workshop - Nyala

In coordination with the Ministry of Health, South Darfur State, and under the supervision of the Emergency Room and Health Centers - Nyala, the Health Strengthening workshop was held from January 13 to 27, 2025.

The main objectives of the workshop were to train volunteers to develop the health aspect, contribute to creating a healthy, disease-free environment, and

spread health awareness among residential complexes.

The workshop targeted four localities in the state: (Nyala North, Nyala South, Kass and Buram), and the workshop was divided into eight groups of 20 health promoters per workshop, with a total number of 160 participants, and the workshop lasted for 5 days for each group.

Supporting the Al-Khair Center for those affected by the war

On December 29, 2024, the Emergency Room and Health Centers - Nyala implemented a project to support the Al-Khair Center of Nyala South Local Government, which aimed to strengthen the bonds of the social fabric, promote solidarity and support those affected in the shelter center, in addition to psychological and moral support and reduce their suffering by contributing to alleviating food costs.

The number of those targeted reached 220 affected men and women, all of whom were supported with meals inside the center.



Shared kitchens project for schools and refugee centers for the month of January 2025

Due to the noticeable increase in the number of displaced persons coming to Nyala city as a result of the cursed war from various states of Sudan, especially the displaced persons from the city of El Fasher who fled the scourge of war to Nyala as their nearest city, the Emergency Room and Health Centers - Nyala implemented during the month of January 2025, a project to operate a number of common kitchens that targeted some secondary schools, basic schools, and shelter centers, which totaled 10 common kitchens, three in schools and seven in shelter centers in different

areas of the city. The number of students benefited significantly from the operation of these kitchens, as the number of students - before the meal - ranged from 90 to 100 students, to 500 students after the kitchens were operational and meals were served.

The work of the volunteers of the Emergency Room and Health Centers - Nyala continues to count the number of displaced people within the state, in order to properly plan the implementation of more projects, activities and events.

Zalingei 13-1-2025:

The Eastern Neighborhood Emergency Room in the Central Darfur state capital Zalingei concluded its campaign to distribute food baskets, where the total number of beneficiaries reached 450 families. The food basket contained basic items including sugar, oil, sauce, in addition to meat, and the Eastern Neighborhood Chamber indicated that it seeks through the distribution of these baskets to

alleviate the suffering of needy families and provide the required support to them in light of the current economic conditions, appreciating the estimated support provided by the Norwegian Council "NRC" to the Chamber and six other emergency rooms in Zalingei, and the Chamber thanked the members of the emergency room and volunteers for their hard work and dedication until the successful completion of this project.

Umm Dukhan local emergency room starts to connect the city hospital with solar energy

Um Dukhan 20-1-2025

The local emergency room in Um Dukhun, Central Darfur State, has started implementing a project to connect the surgical operating room (maternity) and patient wards at Um Dukhun Hospital to the solar energy system. The project aims to provide lighting for the Um Dukhun city reference hospital permanently and for the operating room and patient

wards, in addition to operation on the fans in the hospital departments, which would improve the health service in the hospital, which receives dozens of patients daily, and the chamber praised the support provided by the People to People Organization to implement this project, stressing its hard work to complete the project and submit its final report in the time period agreed upon between it and the supporting party.

Mukjar Local Emergency Room distributes food baskets to displaced people and poor families

Mukjar, January 13, 2025

The Mukjar Local Emergency Room implemented a food basket distribution project to help families most affected by the effects of the war, including displaced families, to cope with the difficult humanitarian conditions, with the support of the Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC).

This initiative comes in response to the urgent necessary needs to alleviate the suffering of citizens, as the food baskets contained basic items that help families meet their needs and enhance their food security, such as sugar, corn, pasta, soap and salt. The Mukjar Emergency Room affirmed its commitment to continue humanitarian work, calling on all supporting organizations in the humanitarian field to stand with the affected communities.



Kassala Youth Emergency Room carries out a service convoy to support families in Hemshkoreb

Kassala, January 1, 2025

The Kassala Youth Emergency Room implemented a service convoy in cooperation with the Hemshkoreb Emergency Room, to provide support to affected families in Hemshkoreb locality. The aid included 100 blankets, 100 mattresses, in addition to basic food items such as lentils, rice, oil, onions, and salt. Cooking equipment was also distributed, including 3 large pots and 3 canons for alternative cooking in areas lacking electricity.

Coordination was done with local community leaders to ensure that the aid was delivered in an organized manner to the most vulnerable. The convoy contributed to improving the living situation of affected families and strengthening the cooperation between Kassala Youth Emergency Room and Hemshkoreb Emergency Room in facing humanitarian challenges.

We cannot ignore their needs or fail to empower them, whether through education or psychosocial support. Supporting girls is a loud message that they are not just victims, they are survivors and inspirations who deserve to be heard and supported by all means.)

In this context, the Nasrat Emergency Room responded to the emergency by providing support to girls of reproductive age, providing 200 baskets for 200 girls of reproductive age in the four Nasrat neighborhoods (A, B, C, and D), divided as follows: Nasrat A 40 baskets, Nasrat B 45 baskets: “Al-Nasr A” 40 baskets, “Al-Nasr B” 45 baskets, “Al-Nasr C” 65



baskets, and “Al-Nasr D” 50 baskets. Each basket contained sanitary pads, toothbrushes and toothpaste, women's clothing, Vaseline, glycerin, and skin moisturizer.

The girls expressed their happiness with this project and considered it a successful step to facilitate and alleviate their suffering.

Meeting the water needs of more than **5000 households** in Al-Jalabi

January 15, 2025

As part of its efforts to provide basic needs and stabilize the situation in the region, the emergency room of Al-Jalabi administrative unit, east of Al-Daein city, East Darfur State, carried out maintenance and operation of the water well, which has been suspended for a long time, the maintenance process was carried out with the support of the CARE organization through the provision of all the shortcomings that hindered the continuation

of water in the well for the past period. The coordinator of the Chamber in the administrative unit said that the operation of the Jalabi well contributes to meeting the needs of more than five thousand families for water and contributes to the stability of the people of the administrative unit in the summer period. The residents of Al-Jalabi praised the role of the Chamber and its work in touching people's basic needs, especially water in the region.



Training Workshop for 50 members of the women's chambers in Apokarnka

On January 18, 2025, the Abu Karnakka Local Women's Emergency Room implemented a training workshop for its members in the field of voluntary humanitarian work, where attendees learned about the basics of volunteer work and the soft skills that help in the work. The workshop was presented by specialized professors in the field, and it is noteworthy that the number of attendees of the workshop reached 50 members of the women's chamber in Abu Karnakah locality.





The founding conference of the State Coordination Council of Emergency Rooms in East Darfur State

On January 15-16, 2025 in Al-Da'ein city, the (113) emergency rooms in East Darfur State held the founding conference of the State Coordination Council of Emergency Rooms in East Darfur State with the participation of 40 representatives from 9 localities, representing 113 emergency rooms distributed among the localities and administrative units in the state. The first day of the conference witnessed the opening session, during which participants presented speeches and scientific papers on humanitarian affairs. Each of the representatives of the localities presented their speeches, and the coordinator of the Darfur Emergency Rooms and the Emergency Response Coordinator addressed the conference via Google Meet. Two scientific papers were presented, the first on the organizational structure presented by the Darfur Emergency Rooms Coordinator, and the second on the experience of emergency rooms and their role in humanitarian work.

The conference concluded its work on the second day with a procedural session in which the atmosphere of humanitarian work and the spirit of solidarity prevailed with the participation of all age and gender groups by free and direct democratic voting, through which the current state coordination council was elected to oversee the work of the emergency rooms in East Darfur state, and a general coordinator of the coordination council in the state was selected.

The founding conference came up with a number of results and recommendations: Issuing a constitution that regulates the work of emergency rooms in the state, which participants agreed on, building flexible organizational structures that promote rapid and effective emergency response, seeking ways to protect volunteers working under these difficult circumstances, and moving forward in building partnerships that serve grassroots work in East Darfur.



Al-Sanut emergency room supports 120 displaced families with food baskets as part of efforts to enhance food security.

On Friday, January 10, 2025, the Al-Sanut Local Emergency Room implemented an initiative to distribute food baskets to support displaced people in Al-Sanut district, with generous funding from the Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC). The initiative included the distribution of 120 food baskets worth EGP 25,000 per basket, containing basic items such as flour, sugar, lentils, millet, and tea.

The initiative comes as part of the emergency room's

ongoing efforts in cooperation with the NRC to enhance food security and meet the needs of the most affected families. For its part, the Al-Sanout Local Emergency Room expressed its sincere thanks to the donors, appreciating the support provided by the NRC and LCC organizations in the success of this humanitarian initiative.

The food basket contained (corn and sugar in addition to lentils), and many parties and personalities in the city have expressed a desire to provide assistance to the displaced through the emergency room in the coming days.

This project comes in response to the urgent need to provide food in the shelters, and in continuation of this project, the Chamber implemented Iftar for the displaced people at the Eastern School shelter in Umm Adara, Al-Haraziya administration.

Within the framework of the Al-Mayram Emergency Room initiative to alleviate the suffering of citizens who have suffered greatly due to displacement, the Al-Mayram Emergency Room launched on Friday, January 10, 2025, the food basket project in Al-Mayram locality, which came under

the slogan: (Together towards voluntary work), at a financial cost of (9,935,000) and targeted 270 families in Al-Mayram administration, and the basket included foodstuffs including (corn, rice, sugar, edible oil and packing bags). In this regard, the Chamber is working diligently to cover all families in the affected areas in the coming period, God willing.



Al-Khowi Emergency Room Distributes 130 Food Baskets

January 2, 2025

After assessing displaced persons in various shelters and adding a limited number of local Al-Khowi families, the emergency room successfully distributed 130 food baskets across four shelters: Mohamed Ahmed Omar Secondary School Shelter, Al-Zahraa School Shelter, Al-Hamraa School Shelter, and Al-Khowi New Secondary School Shelter.

Additionally, a water supply project was implemented for all these centers.

The emergency room noted a significant increase in the number of displaced people arriving from the southern areas of the locality due to recent events. It called for intensified efforts to provide essential services.



Al-Dibb Locality Emergency Room Distributes 450 Food Baskets

On Tuesday, January 14, 2025, the Al-Dibb Locality Emergency Room distributed food baskets to 450 families. This distribution significantly alleviated the hardships faced by displaced persons and refugees from various states of Sudan, as well as internally displaced persons within the locality.

The emergency room procured and repackaged:

- 45 sacks of millet
- 36 jerrycans of oil

- 9 sacks of sugar
 - 18 cartons of soap
- Each family received:

- 3 «malwa» (traditional unit) of millet
- 2 bottles of oil
- 2 pounds of sugar
- 4 bars of soap

East Nile Emergency Room Report on the Situation of Takyas and Solidarity Kitchens in East Nile Locality – January 2025

Amidst the humanitarian and economic challenges facing East Nile Locality, takyas and solidarity kitchens have emerged as a key pillar in supporting the most vulnerable families and individuals. This report aims to highlight the current status of these kitchens, including the number of operational and suspended kitchens, their geographic distribution by sector, and a review of the number of beneficiaries and those deprived of their services.

This report is part of the East Nile Emergency Room's efforts to monitor and analyze essential needs, identify gaps, and facilitate urgent intervention coordination with concerned parties and donors to ensure aid reaches as many people in need as possible.

Status of Kitchens in East Nile Locality:

- ▶ Operational Kitchens: 58 kitchens
- ▶ Suspended Kitchens: 161 kitchens
- ▶ Total Kitchens: 219 kitchens

Distribution of Operational Kitchens by Sectors:

- ▶ West Sector: 23 kitchens

- ▶ Central Sector: 19 kitchens

Narrative Report on the Operation of Kitchens in the Bahri Emergency Room – December 2024

In response to worsening humanitarian conditions, the Bahri Emergency Room continued its efforts in December to provide basic food support through operating the takyas. These efforts targeted providing at least one daily meal to beneficiaries in Bahri city through its four sectors: (North, South, Central, and Rural), reflecting the room's commitment to alleviating the suffering of the population despite significant challenges.

Kitchen Operations:

75 kitchens were operated daily to provide a basic meal for 35,810 beneficiaries.

Breakfast meals included simple and available items like fava beans, lentils, and pasta, cooked using firewood due to electricity and gas outages.

Food Purchase and Distribution:

Food was purchased in two batches to cover the month's needs, with coordination between purchase committees to ensure the availability of foodstuffs.

Supplies were delivered to all four sectors, distributed according to each area's needs.

Operation Management:

Activities were resumed in some kitchens that had been temporarily suspended due to security concerns, while others continued at a steady pace.

Logistical Challenges:

Movement restrictions led to increased transportation costs due to reliance on smaller vehicles to transport foodstuffs.

Key Challenges:

Security Situation: Security disturbances caused population displacement from some neighborhoods, impacting the distribution of beneficiaries among the different sectors. Some kitchens in central Bahri were temporarily closed due to tensions, affecting the continuity of service.

Transportation and Operating Costs: Increased prices of essential goods and transportation costs added a financial burden on kitchen operations.

Limited Resources: Shortages of health supplies and cooking equipment affected the efficiency of daily operations.

Nutrition: Many children suffered from malnutrition due to the imbalance of meals provided, highlighting the need to improve food quality.

Recommendations:

Expand Service: Increase the number of beneficiaries to cover more affected neighborhoods.

Improve Food Quality: Allocate additional funds to provide balanced meals, particularly for children.

Strengthen Logistics: Provide additional fuel for running water pumps to ensure water supply continuity.

Increase Funding for Transportation: Allocate more funds to reduce operation costs.

Support Infrastructure: Allocate funds for acquiring new cooking utensils and health supplies.

Conclusion:

Despite security and economic challenges, the Bahri Emergency Room continues its vital role in providing food and essential services. Local volunteers' efforts to run the kitchens reflect a significant humanitarian commitment to the people of Bahri. By implementing the recommendations, performance can be improved and service coverage can be expanded, contributing to a greater positive impact on the community.

Emergency Rooms Meet the Dutch Ambassador to Sudan, Wierish Ramsoekh

On Thursday, January 23, 2025, representatives from the Grassroots Coordination Council (Emergency Rooms and Sudanese National Organizations) met with Dutch Ambassador Mr. Wiers Ramsook, accompanied by Ms. Hala Hamdallah, Gender Policy and Migration Officer, and Ms. Nicoline van der Turi, the Sudanese contact in The Hague. After introductions, the ambassador explained his country's longstanding relationship with Sudan, expressing concern about the ongoing situation. He outlined his country's roles in advocating for humanitarian issues, supporting food security, addressing migration, the private sector, justice and accountability, and promoting unity and peace.

The meeting was held to hear from emergency rooms about the challenges faced by volunteers on the ground and how to contribute to overcoming them.

In return, the emergency rooms and national organizations expressed gratitude to the Netherlands for its support of Sudan and its people, highlighting the growing challenges due to the ongoing war, including death, arrest, theft of supplies, lack of support, inflation, communication disruptions, and the spread of diseases and natural disasters such as floods.

The meeting lasted two hours, and it was confirmed that communication will continue between both parties in the coming days.
