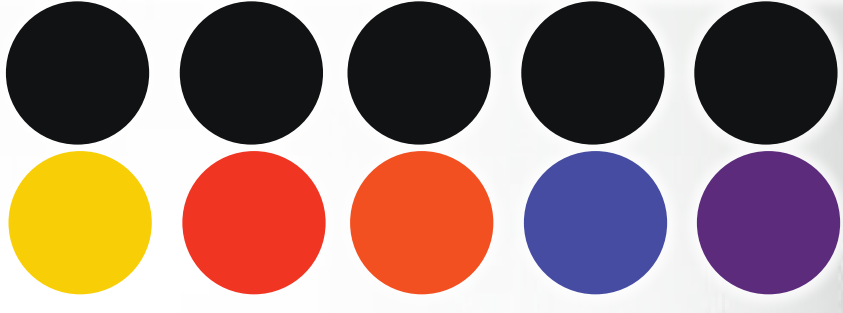

The Suspension of Emergency Services in Nyala Exacerbates the Humanitarian Crisis

Nyala – South Darfur October 2025

The city of Nyala, in South Darfur State, is witnessing a severe deterioration in the humanitarian situation, following the sudden suspension of the Emergency Room and health center services since August 3, 2025. This has led to the worsening suffering of thousands of displaced people who lack the most basic elements of healthcare and humanitarian assistance.

According to local sources from the Emergency Rooms'

membership, about 10,000 new displaced persons are facing tragic conditions due to the absence of medical services and the interruption of food support, at a time when fears of the spread of diseases and malnutrition are increasing.

The most prominent challenges resulting from the suspension of these services are distributed across several axes:

Worsening psychological conditions

Many of those affected live under the weight of psychological trauma caused by the ongoing conflicts and deteriorating living conditions.

Transportation and supply crises

Security barriers and imposed restrictions are hindering the movement of humanitarian aid, slowing down the response to the growing needs in camps and affected areas.

Lack of funding and logistical support

National and international funding has been affected by the freezing of some aid, which has limited the ability to provide essential supplies to the displaced.

Food shortage

The halt of the communal kitchens, which used to provide daily meals to those in need, has led to an increased risk of hunger and famine among the most vulnerable groups.

In light of this reality, there is an urgent need to restore the operation of health facilities and ensure the continuity of humanitarian services. Strengthening cooperation between the Sudanese Ministry of Health and international organizations, especially UNICEF, is considered a crucial step to reinforce emergency response and provide food and healthcare to affected

communities.

Observers affirm that the continuation of international and local support constitutes an essential element for maintaining food and health security in crisis environments and for alleviating the humanitarian suffering that worsens day by day in Nyala and its surroundings.



The Outbreak of Epidemic Diseases in South Darfur Exacerbates the Health and Humanitarian Crisis

Nyala - South Darfur

Since early July 2025, South Darfur State has been witnessing a widespread outbreak of epidemic diseases, including cholera, malaria, dengue fever, watery diarrhea, and typhoid, leading to a further deterioration in the health situation in a state already suffering from the effects of ongoing conflicts.

Health experts attribute this spread to contaminated water sources, poor sanitation conditions, overcrowding of displaced people in shelters, and the weakness of the health system, which has been affected by war, lack of funding, and logistical challenges.

Causes of the Disease Outbreak

Water contamination:

Many residents rely on unsafe water sources, leading to the spread of waterborne diseases.

Poor public hygiene:

Low health awareness and the absence of adequate sanitation facilities have increased the risk of infection.

Overcrowding of displaced people:

The high number of displaced persons in shelters has placed enormous pressure on sanitation services.

Deterioration of the health system:

Many health facilities have ceased operations due to the war, hindering the delivery of basic medical services.

Lack of funding:

Weak national and international support has reduced the capacity of health institutions to respond to the

spread of epidemics.

Prevention and Response Efforts:

Health authorities recommend urgent preventive measures to limit the spread of diseases, including:

Improving water quality through sterilization and boiling.

Promoting personal hygiene by washing hands with soap and water.

Conducting vaccination campaigns against cholera in affected areas.

Controlling disease vectors through insecticides and mosquito nets.

Intensifying community awareness campaigns on proper health behaviors.

Proposed Solutions

Local officials and humanitarian organizations emphasize the need to support the health sector by improving infrastructure and providing adequate funding, in addition to expanding clean water networks and intensifying health education and community awareness programs. Humanitarian organizations working in the region have affirmed that strengthening cooperation between the government and international organizations is the most effective way to contain the spread of epidemics and improve the health situation in South Darfur, thereby helping to reduce human suffering and promote public health in the region.



The Emergency Room in Mukjar Launches “Child-Friendly Spaces” to Support Children Amid Crises

Mukjar - Central Darfur

Amid growing crises and the shrinking of safe spaces for children, the Emergency Room in Mukjar locality has launched the “Child-Friendly Spaces” project, supported by the Central Darfur Emergency Rooms Coordination Council. The initiative aims to provide a safe and positive environment where children can play, learn, and grow despite the challenges surrounding them.

The project seeks to:

Create a safe environment that restores the brightness of childhood and enhances children’s sense of safety and stability.

Provide a space for play, learning, and dreaming, giving

children moments of joy and social interaction in a reality that desperately needs hope.

The Emergency Room in Mukjar emphasized that caring for children is not a luxury, but a fundamental step toward building a healthy human being and a balanced nation. The room expressed its deep gratitude to everyone who contributed to the launch of the project and called on the local community and partners to join the initiative to expand opportunities for children, affirming that childhood surrounded by love and care is the foundation for a more peaceful and humane future.

Rongatas Emergency Room Concludes Water Station Maintenance Program in the Eastern Neighborhood

Rongatas - Azum Locality, Sunday, October 19, 2025

The Water and Environment Committee of the Rongatas Emergency Room has concluded the maintenance program of the Eastern Neighborhood Water Station in the Rongatas camp, following tireless efforts by volunteers who contributed significantly to the success of this vital task.

This program comes within the framework of community participation in addressing local challenges and promoting constructive behavior and engagement. It aims to:

- 1 Solve the water shortage problem in the main center of the camp.
- 2 Provide clean groundwater to reduce health problems caused by water contamination.
- 3 Reduce expenses related to purchasing water from external sources.

The Rongatas Emergency Room expressed its sincere thanks and appreciation to the Grassroots Coordination Council of the Emergency Rooms for its continuous support of these initiatives, emphasizing the importance of community cooperation in improving the quality of life and providing essential services to residents.





Health and Environmental Interventions by the Hamashkoreib Youth Emergency Room to Reduce Epidemic Risks

Hamashkoreib - October 11, 2025

The Hamashkoreib Youth Emergency Room continues its community efforts by implementing the Environmental Sanitation Project and the Free Treatment Day at Hamashkoreib Rural Hospital, as part of its activities to confront the rainy season emergencies and reduce the spread of diseases.

The Environmental Sanitation Project included spraying inside homes and markets, fog spraying in neighborhoods, removal of more than 30 tons of waste, in addition to uprooting mesquite trees from an area exceeding 4 acres, with the aim of improving environmental health and reducing epidemic risks.

In the same context, the room organized the Free Treatment Day in cooperation with the Kassala Youth Emergency Room, with the participation of an internal medicine specialist and a pediatrician, where 265 patients benefited from medical services, in addition to conducting more than 220 medical tests and providing free medications.

The room affirmed the continuation of implementing health and environmental initiatives in cooperation with partners, in an effort to promote community health and ensure a safe environment during the rainy season.



Khashm El Girba Emergency Room Rehabilitates Al-Abbas Ibn Abd Al-Muttalib Boys' Basic School

Khashm El Girba - October 24, 2025

As part of its ongoing efforts to improve the educational process and enhance the school environment, the Khashm El Girba Emergency Room has launched a project to rehabilitate Al-Abbas Ibn Abd Al-Muttalib Boys' Basic School in Village (2) Arab, aiming to improve the quality of education and provide a safe and comfortable learning environment for students.

The project aims to raise students' academic performance by improving the school environment. The work included the rehabilitation of four classrooms, which involved installing roofs, repairing and treating walls, cement plastering, painting the walls, and painting the doors and windows.

The room confirmed that the project completion rate has reached 90%, marking an important step toward improving the quality of education in the area. This was achieved thanks to the efforts of the room's team

and volunteers who contributed to creating a safe and motivating learning environment for students.

The room's administration indicated that the project comes within an integrated plan to develop schools and support the educational process in the most in-need areas, stressing its commitment to continue implementing initiatives that contribute to improving the educational environment and achieving sustainable development in the education sector.



Kassala Youth Emergency Room Presents the Play "The Clothesline" to Promote Coexistence and Social Peace

Kassala - September 30, 2025

As part of its efforts to raise community awareness and promote values of unity and peaceful coexistence, the Kassala Youth Emergency Room, in cooperation with Shamoos Organization for Development and the Ritaj Theater Group, organized theatrical performances titled "The Clothesline" as part of its cultural program aimed at using art as a tool for positive change.

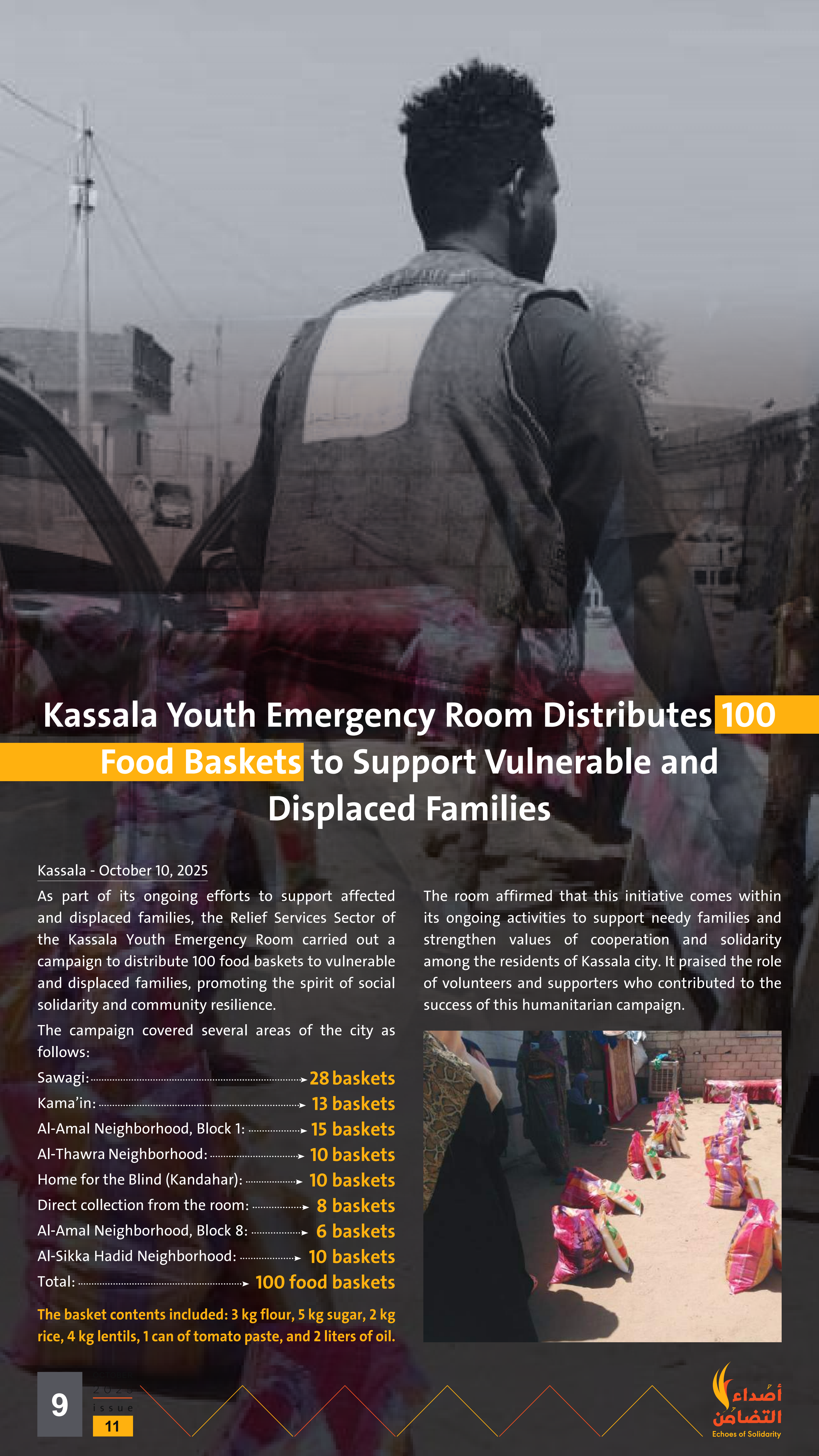
The first performance was held at the West Gash

Center, and the second in the Barno Market, amid great interaction from citizens who expressed their admiration for the artistic content and humanitarian messages of the play.

The play addressed the theme of social peace in an enjoyable and realistic artistic manner, reflecting the spirit of coexistence and love among community members. It delivered powerful messages about the importance of rejecting conflicts and uniting efforts to build a cohesive and safe society.

The Emergency Room expressed its appreciation to the Ritaj Theater Group for their creative performance and to Shamoos Organization for Development for their active partnership, praising the contributions of all parties involved in the success of this initiative that combined art with a humanitarian message.





Kassala Youth Emergency Room Distributes **100** Food Baskets to Support Vulnerable and Displaced Families

Kassala - October 10, 2025

As part of its ongoing efforts to support affected and displaced families, the Relief Services Sector of the Kassala Youth Emergency Room carried out a campaign to distribute 100 food baskets to vulnerable and displaced families, promoting the spirit of social solidarity and community resilience.

The campaign covered several areas of the city as follows:

- Sawagi:> **28 baskets**
- Kama'in:> **13 baskets**
- Al-Amal Neighborhood, Block 1:> **15 baskets**
- Al-Thawra Neighborhood:> **10 baskets**
- Home for the Blind (Kandahar):> **10 baskets**
- Direct collection from the room:> **8 baskets**
- Al-Amal Neighborhood, Block 8:> **6 baskets**
- Al-Sikka Hadid Neighborhood:> **10 baskets**
- Total:> **100 food baskets**

The basket contents included: 3 kg flour, 5 kg sugar, 2 kg rice, 4 kg lentils, 1 can of tomato paste, and 2 liters of oil.

The room affirmed that this initiative comes within its ongoing activities to support needy families and strengthen values of cooperation and solidarity among the residents of Kassala city. It praised the role of volunteers and supporters who contributed to the success of this humanitarian campaign.





“Kitchens of Hope” in Selik - Local Efforts to Save Displaced People from Hunger and Suffering

Selik - North Darfur, October 23, 2025

Amid the siege on El Fasher and the collapse of basic services, hundreds of thousands of citizens have fled to safer areas, facing perilous journeys marked by hunger and thirst. Many arrived at Selik Camp in Kurma with nothing but the clothes on their backs, confronting a harsh reality of overcrowding and a severe lack of essential resources.

In this context, the Selik Camp Emergency Room, in collaboration with the North Darfur Emergency Rooms Council, launched a community kitchen to provide at least one meal per day to the most vulnerable families, a meal that has become the only lifeline for many displaced people. This project reflects the strength of local solidarity in the face of disaster, but it remains a temporary solution amid the rising number of displaced persons and growing pressure on limited resources. The displaced continue to face dire conditions, including shortages of food, shelter, and drinking water, along with the absence of essential health services.

The Emergency Room affirmed that the continuation of

the kitchen depends primarily on volunteer efforts and local support, calling on the international community and humanitarian organizations to provide more food assistance, shelter materials, and medical services to ensure the sustainability of support and save lives in the displacement camps. This achievement represents a model of local humanitarian action, but at the same time, it stands as an urgent call for international humanitarian actors to intervene and provide the necessary support in the face of an ever-worsening crisis in North Darfur.



El Fasher Emergency Room Heals the Wounds of Civilians Amid Siege and Collapse

El Fasher - North Darfur, October 12, 2025

As violence escalates and a suffocating siege is imposed on El Fasher city, thousands of civilian families face an unprecedented humanitarian tragedy. Amid this crisis, the El Fasher Emergency Room and Camp Committees stand as a vital lifeline and a beacon of hope against enormous challenges.

The work of the room reflects the extraordinary commitment of medical teams and volunteers who provide necessary treatment to dozens of wounded people every day, including those with serious injuries requiring urgent surgical intervention despite the severe shortage of medical supplies, medicines, surgical equipment, and specialized staff. These efforts represent the final line of defense to preserve the minimum level of health services in the city.

Officials in the room indicate that the perseverance of the medical team is a powerful outcry that reveals the scale of the humanitarian suffering of more than 10,000 besieged civilians struggling simultaneously with hunger and disease. The room stressed that its continued operation depends on international and humanitarian support, affirming that immediate aid is not an option, but a moral and historical responsibility to ensure the survival of civilians in El Fasher.



“Community Kitchens” Project A Humanitarian Initiative to Support Newly Displaced Families in Tawila and Jebel Marra

Tawila - North Darfur, October 21, 2025

The Tawila and Jebel Marra Emergency Rooms Coordination Council launched the “Community Kitchens” Project on Monday morning, as part of emergency response efforts to support newly displaced families fleeing El Fasher and surrounding areas due to the deteriorating humanitarian situation in North Darfur State.

The project aims to alleviate the suffering of displaced families and provide daily meals under extremely difficult living conditions. It will continue for ten consecutive days and target more than 200 families who have recently settled in temporary gathering sites around Tawila.

The opening ceremony was attended by representatives of local emergency rooms and volunteers, who immediately began preparing and distributing the first meals to the beneficiary families amid an atmosphere of gratitude and hope.

A project coordinator told the Media Office that the initiative comes as an urgent response to the increasing needs on the ground, noting that emergency teams

work around the clock to secure food and water and to monitor the health conditions in the new displacement sites.

He added that the project is not limited to food provision but also seeks to strengthen values of cooperation and social solidarity between the displaced and the host communities, thereby fostering a more stable and cohesive environment.

The “Community Kitchens” project is an extension of the Council’s ongoing efforts in Tawila and Jebel Marra to support those affected by the worsening humanitarian crisis. It demonstrates the Council’s commitment to rapid and effective response to citizens’ needs in displacement areas.





Haskanita Stands in Solidarity: **200 Food Baskets** Distributed to Affected, Displaced, and Elderly Families

Haskanita - North Darfur, October 17, 2025

In a humanitarian initiative reflecting the spirit of solidarity and community support, the Haskanita Emergency Room, in coordination with the Al-Laeit Locality Emergency Rooms Council and with support from the North Darfur State Emergency Rooms Council, carried out a distribution campaign of 200 food baskets for affected families, displaced persons, and the elderly in the area. The food baskets contained essential items such as sugar, onions, lentils, and flour, and targeted the most vulnerable families and those facing difficulties in securing their daily food needs. The initiative helped ease their suffering and improve their living conditions. Several beneficiaries expressed their gratitude and appreciation for this kind gesture, noting that the assistance came at a critical time when they were in desperate need, restoring their hope and trust in the spirit of one community. Members of the Emergency Room explained that the initiative comes within their

ongoing efforts to promote values of solidarity and social responsibility, affirming their commitment to continue humanitarian work and support affected groups. They also called for continued support for local initiatives to ensure that aid reaches families in need and to strengthen community resilience in the face of the current humanitarian challenges.





Naeem Camp Emergency Room Launches Community Drive to Build “Al-Wahda” School for Camp Students.

Naeem Camp - East Darfur, October 2025

In preparation for the 2025/2026 academic year and in response to the poor infrastructure of existing schools, the Naeem Camp Emergency Room, Sector (C) launched a community campaign to construct Al-Wahda School inside the Naeem displaced persons camps. The initiative aims to provide a suitable learning environment for children from the Sabrin, Lagawa, and Gereida camps.

The initiative focuses on building three classrooms using local materials, relying on community efforts and donations from local benefactors, in coordination with the education administration and community committees. This step reinforces the role of Emergency Rooms in supporting essential services and affirms

children’s right to education even under conditions of displacement and hardship.

The Emergency Room called on all community members to participate in the drive, emphasizing that supporting children’s education is an investment in their future and a reflection of solidarity and collective responsibility to ensure a safe and motivating learning environment.



El Daein Women’s Emergency Room Holds Awareness Workshop on Breast Cancer as Part of Pink October Activities.

El Daein - October 7, 2025

ElDaein Women’s Emergency Room organized a training workshop on breast cancer awareness, targeting 50 female volunteers. The event was held at the Museum Hall of the University of El Daein as part of global Pink October activities to raise awareness about breast cancer and support affected women.

The workshop aimed to encourage women to prioritize their health and undergo regular check-ups, emphasizing early detection as an effective method for prevention and timely intervention. The sessions covered definitions, causes, and prevention methods of breast cancer, along with a practical training on how to perform self-examinations and correct common misconceptions about the disease.

At the end of the workshop, the Emergency Room reaffirmed its commitment to continuing health awareness programs across local communities, stressing that “a cancer-free future begins with every woman’s awareness of her own body and health.”





El Daein Emergency Room

Provides Medical and Community Sanitation Services to Support Vulnerable Families.

El Daein - October 2025

Throughout this month, the El Daein Humanitarian Emergency Room, represented by its Health Office, delivered comprehensive medical services to 1,567 individuals from vulnerable and displaced families fleeing conflict-affected areas across Sudan.

The services included the provision of medicines and treatments for five surgical operations and three cesarean deliveries, as part of the Emergency Room's ongoing efforts to provide healthcare and support to those most in need.

Additionally, the Emergency Room launched a wide-scale sanitation campaign at the University of El Daein over the past two weeks, involving a large number of volunteers and faculty members who praised the initiative as the first of its kind for the institution. The

campaign concluded with a partnership between the Emergency Room and East Darfur Radio and Television, which resumed broadcasting earlier this month to raise public awareness on environmental health.

The Emergency Room emphasized that these initiatives are part of its broader mission to promote public health, enhance community hygiene, and support the most vulnerable families in the state.



Women's Emergency Room

in Al-Qadamia Village Supports a Needy Woman Through a Groundnut Harvest Collective Drive

Abu Karanka - East of El Daein, October 2025

Demonstrating community solidarity and social cooperation, the Women's Emergency Room in Al-Qadamia Village, located 55 km east of El Daein in Abu Karnaka Locality, carried out a collective effort to harvest



groundnuts on behalf of Ms. Zeinab Mohammed.

According to the Room's media office, the initiative came after learning about Zeinab's difficult circumstances, she is the sole caregiver for her children and lacked assistance with her farm, making it impossible for her to complete the harvest alone. Residents of the area praised the initiative and expressed their gratitude for this thoughtful act, which reflects the community's spirit of solidarity and compassion for the most vulnerable families.

Al-Dabbab Locality Emergency Room

Distributes 400 Food Baskets to Support the Displaced in West Kordofan

Al-Dabbab - West Kordofan, October 10, 2025

As part of its efforts to ensure food security and support displaced persons affected by the war, the Al-Dabbab Locality Emergency Room distributed 400 food baskets to the neediest families in shelter centers, at a cost of 13,750,000 Sudanese pounds.

The food baskets included essential materials such as sorghum, sugar, and soap, aiming to alleviate the suffering of displaced families and improve their living conditions amid the difficult humanitarian challenges.

Beneficiaries expressed their gratitude to the donors and volunteers who contributed to the success of this initiative, affirming that local and international community support represents a lifeline for families affected by the war.

The Emergency Room emphasized the importance of continuing support and community solidarity to reduce the suffering of displaced people, reiterating its humanitarian message calling for peace and rejection of violence.



Babanusa Emergency Room Organizes Breast Cancer Awareness Day Under the Slogan “Sudan Without Cancer”

Umm Jak - West Kordofan, October 21, 2025

Babanusa Locality Emergency Room in the Umm Jak Administrative Unit organized an awareness day on breast cancer, as part of the global Pink October campaign, under the slogan “Sudan Without Cancer.”

The event included awareness sessions focusing on the importance of early detection of breast cancer, introducing health risks, and encouraging regular medical follow-ups. It also provided safe spaces for women to discuss their health issues freely and

consciously.

The day witnessed wide participation from women and girls, which strengthened the spirit of solidarity among them inside the shelter centers and helped spread health awareness in the local community. Hygiene kits were also distributed to all participants, who expressed appreciation for the support provided and thanked the volunteers for their great efforts in making the event a success.



Emergency and Construction Room Launches Free Medical Camp at Ghubeish Hospital

Ghubeish - Monday, October 20, 2025

Under the slogan “With Giving We Ease the Pain, and With Mercy We Restore the Smile,” the Emergency and Construction Room in Ghubeish Locality launched the free medical camp at Ghubeish Hospital this morning, amid wide attendance and interaction from citizens and beneficiaries. The camp continues for five days, targeting patients from displaced persons, refugees, and host communities, as part of the room’s efforts to alleviate humanitarian suffering and provide free healthcare to everyone in need in the area.

The program includes specialized clinics in internal

medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, dermatology, dentistry, and ophthalmology, in addition to general clinics supervised by doctors and medical assistants, with laboratory tests and free medicines provided. The camp also includes awareness and educational campaigns aimed at enhancing health awareness and disease prevention. Emergency and Construction Room affirmed that this activity embodies the values of giving and human solidarity, based on its belief that treatment is a right for every person, and that compassion is a noble message that unites efforts to serve those in need.



Lagawa Emergency Room Implements Medical Camp for the Displaced of Al-Arak with Support from Proximity Organization

Lagawa - West Kordofan - Tuesday, October 15, 2025

The Lagawa Locality Emergency Room carried out a medical camp at the health center in Al-Arak area on Tuesday, aimed at providing free medical treatment and health supplies to more than 300 patients from the displaced community, with support from Proximity Organization as part of its health sector assistance efforts.

The medical services included treating epidemic diseases, fevers, infections, and diarrhea, along with monitoring malnourished children. The camp also featured health awareness sessions focusing on the dangers of dengue fever and acute watery diarrhea (cholera) amid rising infection rates among displaced people.

Beneficiaries expressed their gratitude and appreciation to the Emergency Room, Proximity Organization, and the volunteer medical teams, confirming that the initiative helped ease their suffering and improve their health conditions.

For its part, the Lagawa Emergency Room expressed its appreciation to the volunteers and supporting organizations, affirming its commitment to continuing humanitarian and medical work to serve communities affected by the humanitarian situation.

The room concluded its statement by expressing hope for peace and stability throughout Sudan.

At the Heart of Al-Khowei: 207 Food Baskets Save Displaced Families from the Agony of Displacement

Al-Khowei - Monday, October 13, 2025

In a humanitarian initiative reflecting the spirit of solidarity and social cooperation, the Al-Khowei Locality Emergency Room began distributing 207 food baskets this morning to displaced families from Al-Khowei city, with support from Proximity Organization, as part of its ongoing efforts to ease the suffering of people affected by the humanitarian situation. The food baskets contained essential items such as sugar, flour, oil, lentils, and onions, to meet families' needs amid the harsh living conditions imposed by displacement.

During the distribution, several beneficiaries expressed their deep gratitude to the Emergency Room and Proximity Organization, confirming that this initiative helped reduce their daily hardships and gave them a sense of stability and safety amid the harsh reality of displacement.

For its part, the Al-Khowei Emergency Room affirmed its continued efforts to support affected families and implement more humanitarian and relief initiatives that restore hope and smiles to the faces of displaced people, stressing that humanitarian work will remain its top priority until peace and stability prevail throughout Sudan.



East Nile Emergency Room Steady Steps... Lasting Impact

As part of the East Nile Emergency Room's ongoing efforts to enhance basic services and support community stability, the grassroots Hilla Kuku Emergency Room oversaw the installation of an integrated solar energy system for the main water pumping station (bayarah) in Hilla Kuku a vital source that supplies water to wide areas including:

Hilla Kuku Market

Blocks (1, 2, 3, 4)

Hilla Kuku Extensio

Block 10

Al-Alban East

This step represents a major shift toward improving the stability of the water supply for thousands of residents and reducing their suffering caused by water cuts and difficulty in accessing a safe and clean source.

The attached video shows all project stages from the beginning, preparing the site for installation, receiving materials, setting up the panels and equipment, and finally operating the bayarah with solar energy as intended.

This project is part of our continuous efforts to adopt

sustainable energy and water solutions, at the lowest cost and greatest impact, despite the scarcity of resources and immense challenges.
