

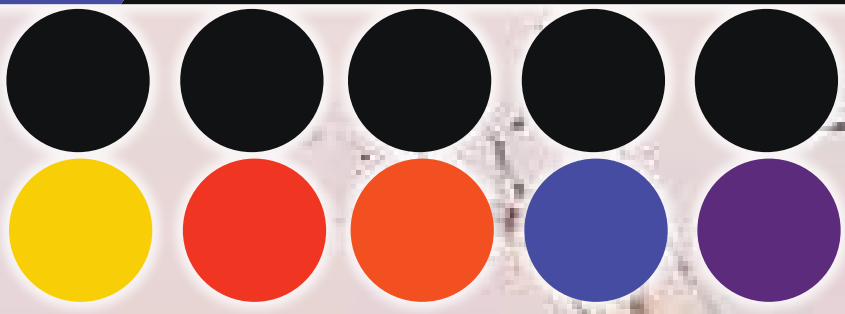

# Editorial

Sudanese people in various states of the country are living the most difficult moments of their lives, after the war entered its third year and the outbreak of cholera in large parts of the country, with the spread of dengue fever and malaria, and many hospitals out of service, the situation has reached unprecedented humanitarian conditions and everyone has become in a state of horror and panic, especially since the autumn season has already begun, which warns of an imminent health disaster if efforts are not concerted to save the situation. UNICEF had earlier announced that more than one million children are at risk with the spread of cholera in Khartoum state in Sudan, and the emergency and construction ERRs in West Kordofan state issued an urgent appeal to all health authorities and humanitarian and relief organizations after the first cases of cholera were recorded in the city of Abuzabad, confirming that the number of cases in the hospital has reached 13 cases, including 4 deaths.

In addition to the health challenges faced by Sudanese people, there are also major challenges in the aspect of food security. News and reports from the ground through the emergency rooms of the Grassroots Coordination Council indicate a large and mass stoppage of a number of kitchens in different localities in the states of North Darfur, Khartoum, West Kordofan, South Darfur and other states, in addition to the scarcity of food commodities or their availability at exorbitant prices.

Dozens of emergency rooms appealed to international organizations, donors and philanthropists to intervene quickly to remedy the situation with regard to the food, water and medicine crises to save lives before the situation explodes to an irreversible point.

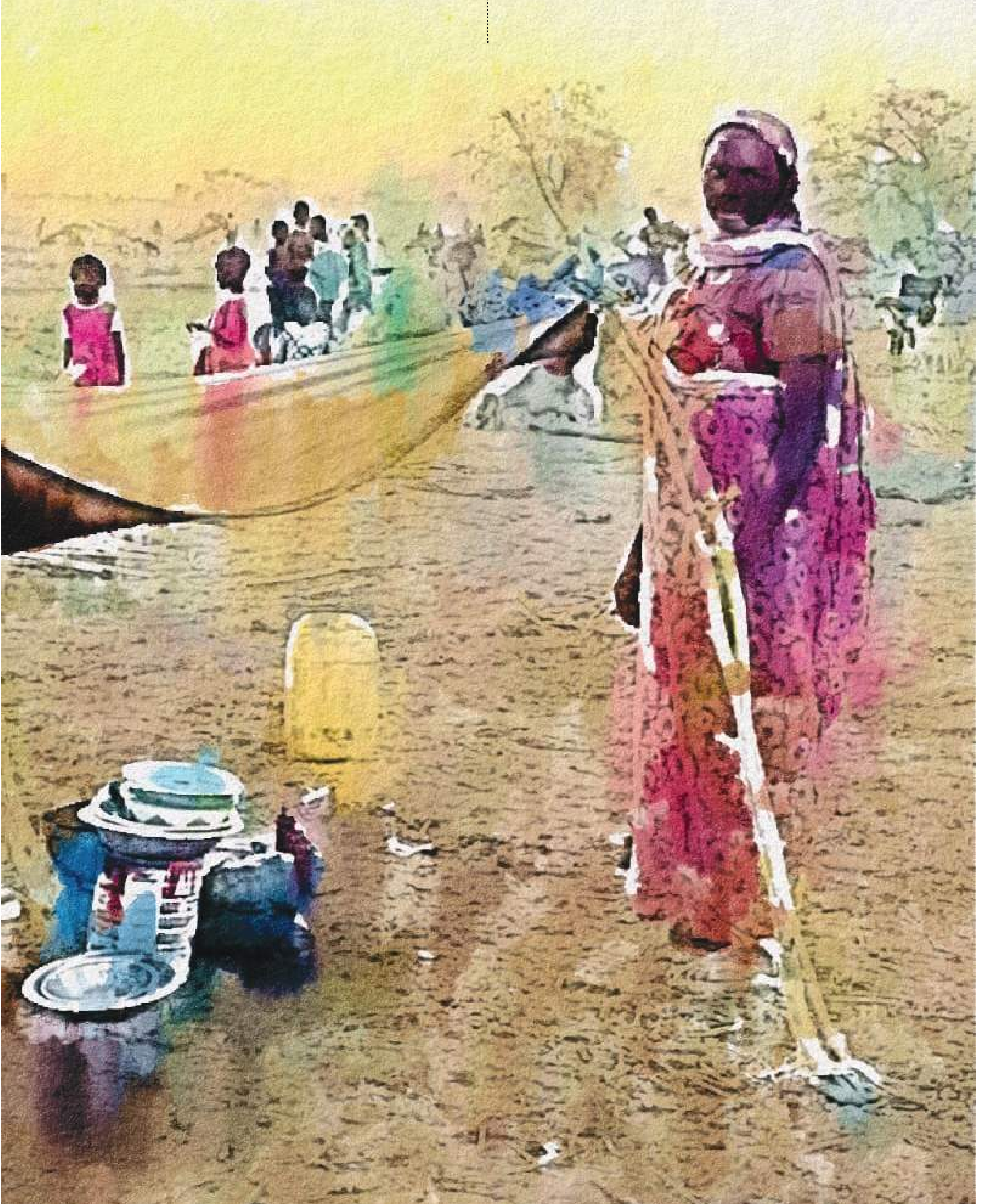

# Communal kitchens out of service in Nyala, South Darfur

June 2025

A number of humanitarian support programs for displaced people in South Darfur, especially in Nyala city, have stopped in recent weeks, leading to a marked deterioration of the humanitarian situation inside shelters and schools hosting thousands of displaced families. According to emergency coordinators and community representatives, food support, health services, water, and even communal kitchens have come to a standstill due to lack of funding and resources, at a time when the need remains urgent, especially as the number of displaced people increases as a result of the ongoing security incidents.

«The need has not stopped,» says a volunteer in Nyala's emergency rooms. «There are children sleeping without dinner, sick women without medicine, and every day we face more difficult situations.»

Observers warn that the continuation of this situation may lead to a worsening of the health and nutritional crises among the IDPs, which calls for urgent action to correct the disaster before it worsens because the

communal kitchens that used to provide daily meals to the IDPs in a number of shelters have stopped due to the discontinuation of humanitarian support, which has exacerbated the suffering of displaced families. This has exacerbated the suffering of displaced families, especially children, women, the elderly and the sick, who are completely dependent on these meals in the absence of sources of income or the possibility of independent cooking, as the displaced face extremely difficult humanitarian conditions in light of food shortages, high temperatures and deteriorating health conditions. Displaced families appeal to the concerned authorities and humanitarian organizations to urgently intervene to reopen these kitchens or find urgent alternatives to fill the food gap, restore support and provide the minimum basic needs, in light of the lack of alternatives and the absence of job opportunities or stable sources of income.



## South Darfur's third solar-powered well in South Darfur

In light of the increasing struggle to obtain clean water, the high price of water and the stoppage of pumping to neighborhoods for nearly three months, the Emergency Room and Health Centers in Nyala operated the third well at the city's main water station with solar energy. This comes as a radical solution to the dilemma of operating with thermal fuel, which contributes to the continuity of water pumping. The increase in fuel prices led to the cessation of pumping in the past three months and exacerbated the crisis, which resulted in high water prices, thus increasing the financial burden on citizens and preventing them from obtaining clean drinking water as a result of the pumping being stopped. The Emergency Room and Health Centers/Nyala intervened and operated

the third well as a second step with solar power, which helped reduce the dependence on thermal fuel and partially improve the continuity of water pumping. This completed the installation of solar energy systems for three wells.

The Nyala Emergency and Health Centers ERR's aims to operate the Nyala City Water Main Station with solar power in order to ensure 70% water availability for Nyala City, reduce the suffering of citizens caused by water scarcity, and reduce the spread of diseases caused by water contamination. The ERR is still facing challenges to operate two other wells in the main station with solar energy, in addition to providing motors for towing.





## Kabar Emergency Room distributes food baskets to IDPs and vulnerable families in the area

Under the supervision of the Um Dukhun Local Emergency Room Coordination Council, the Kabar Base Emergency Room in Um Dukhun locality implemented a food aid distribution program targeting 200 displaced and vulnerable families in the area, as part of the grant provided by the Central Darfur Emergency Room Coordination Council in coordination with Localization Hub to improve the food security of displaced families by providing

direct food aid, supporting initiatives that help them secure their food in sustainable ways, reducing hunger and malnutrition among groups affected by the conflict, especially women, children and the elderly, enabling them to live with dignity and enhance their ability to adapt and cope. Each distributed basket contained: "2 handfuls of millet bread, 1 handful of peanuts, 3 lb sugar, 1 tea packet, 1 salt packet, 1 bar of laundry soap".





## To meet the hunger of hundreds of families, the Hamidiya Camp Emergency Room in Zalingei set up a communal kitchen for displaced people in the camp

June 14, 2025

The Hamidiya Camp Emergency Room in Zalingei held a communal kitchen to help hundreds of displaced and vulnerable families in the camp with the generous support of the Central Darfur Emergency Rooms Coordination Council, where the program aimed to provide hot daily meals for war victims from children, widows, the elderly

and the vulnerable, and the room indicated that the aim of organizing the kitchen is to achieve food security for families affected by the war as a humanitarian and moral duty. The role of the parties supporting the project is sincerely appreciated .



## Launching of the capacity building workshop for the Karsila Emergency Room volunteers

June 21, 2025

As part of its continuous endeavor to develop performance and raise the capacities of volunteers, Karsila Emergency Room organized a capacity building workshop under the title: Project Management, with the wide participation of the room's volunteers. The workshop aims to enhance the knowledge and skills of volunteers, which contributes

to improving emergency response and providing more effective humanitarian services to affected communities. This initiative comes within the ERR's continuous efforts to rehabilitate and develop its working cadres, emphasizing its commitment to the principle of impartial and independent humanitarian work.



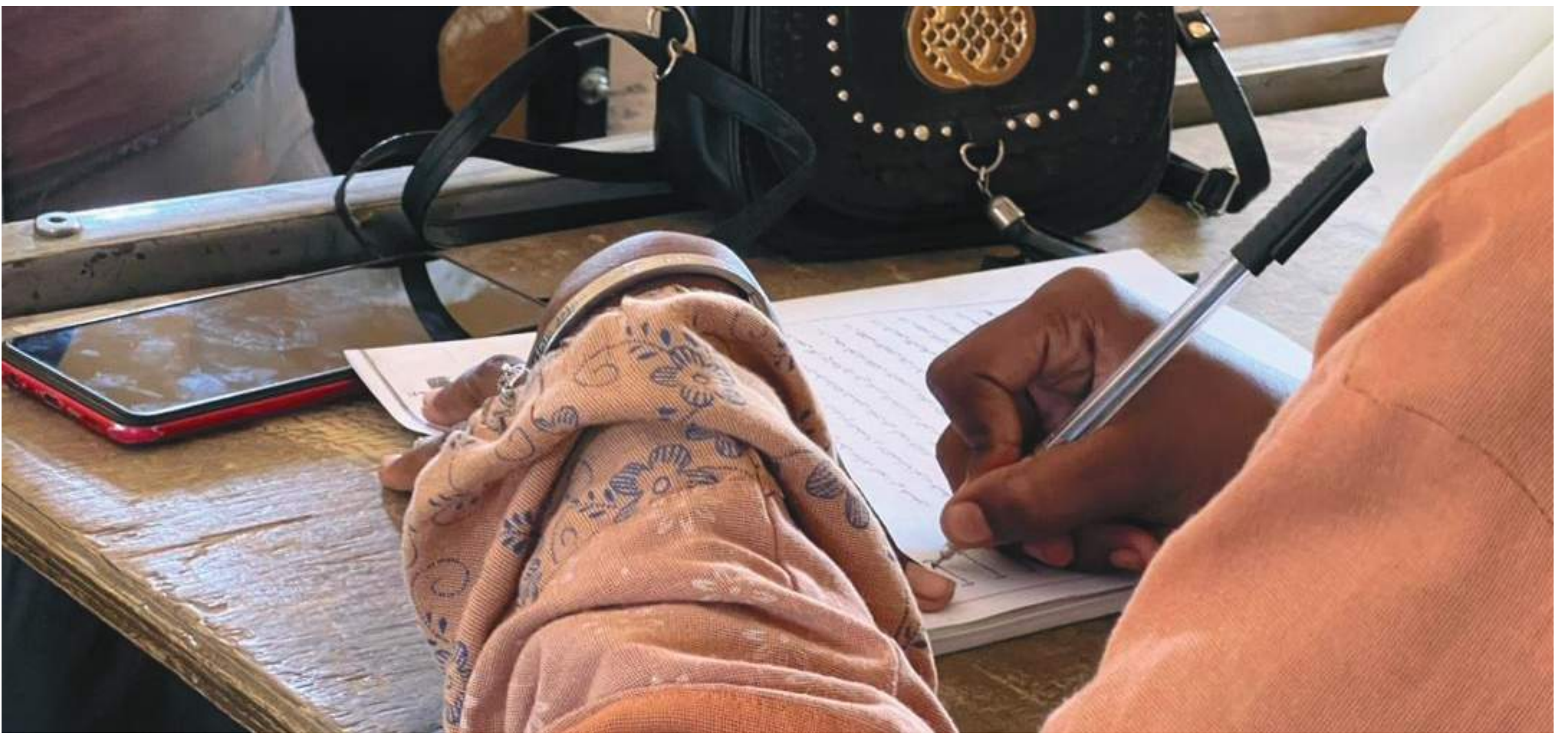
## Initiative to distribute sacrificial animals and living materials in support of affected families in Kassala State

June 7, 2025

The Kassala Youth Emergency Room - Services Office implemented a humanitarian initiative to distribute sacrificial animals and basic living materials to affected families residing in shelters, as part of its efforts to promote solidarity and community interdependence. The initiative included the meat distribution of 9 sacrificial animals “sheep”, as well as gallons of oil and sacks of charcoal, benefiting hundreds of families facing difficult living conditions. The initiative aims to ease the burden on these families and enable them to celebrate Eid in an atmosphere of dignity and compassion. The organizers of the initiative emphasized that its aim is to support vulnerable groups and promote the spirit of community participation, stressing that the support provided is a message of solidarity in light of the exceptional circumstances that the state is going



through. The ERR also explained that these efforts are part of a series of humanitarian initiatives aimed at alleviating the suffering of those affected, calling on all parties and individuals to contribute to expanding the circle of support during this sensitive period.



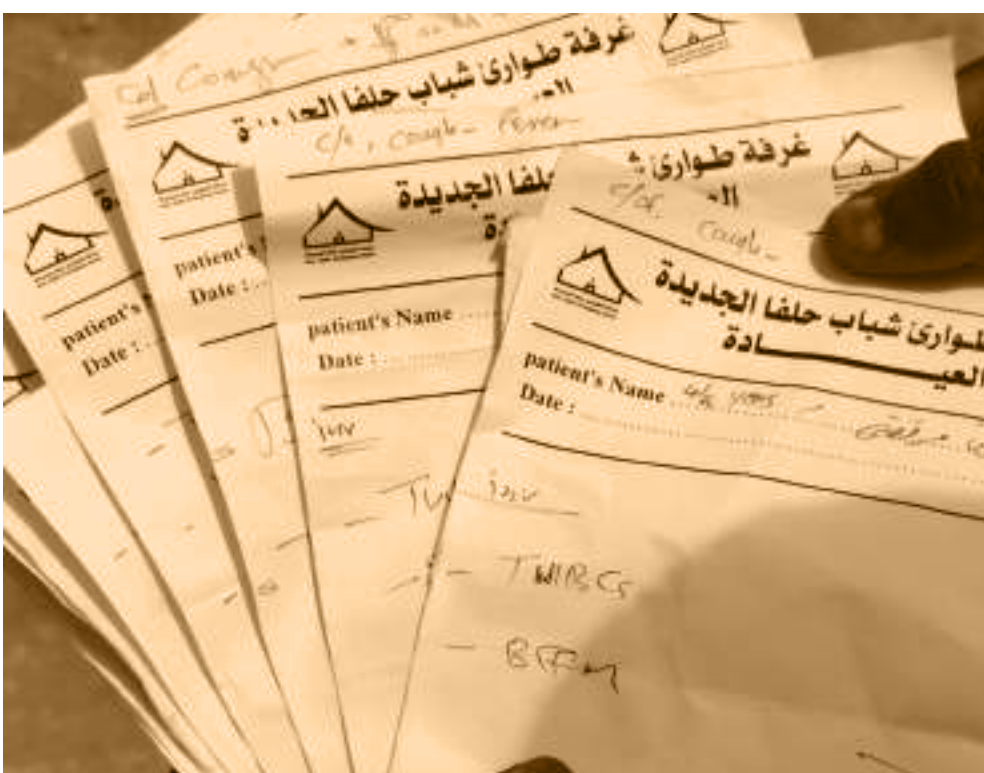
## Academic Support Project to support Sudanese certificate students

June 15 2025

The Kassala Youth Emergency Room has announced the launch of the Academic Support Project, which aims to provide support and assistance to students of the 2024 Sudanese High School Certificate exams in the state. This initiative comes as part of the ERR's plans to enhance academic support for students, believing in the importance of psychological and educational support at the critical stage of exams. The project plan included covering students in the West and East banks, with a focus on psychological support to prepare students psychologically

and socially to successfully pass the exams.

The Emergency Room is collaborating with important partners in this project, namely HOPE for Psychosocial Support and Adeela for Culture and Arts, to provide the necessary support and create the appropriate environment for students. The ERR invites all students wishing to benefit from the project to register through the available means of communication, wishing everyone success in their exams.



## Shelter Centre Clinics Project in New Halfa

June 14-15 2025

In the heart of displacement and the pain of waiting, the New Halfa Youth Emergency Room - Health Office set up a field clinic in the middle of the Egyptian school. But it was not just a clinic, it was a space of comfort and reassurance, where there was someone to listen to the complaint, extend a hand with medicine, and gently say: «You are not alone.»

Over the course of two days, the medical team and volunteers provided comprehensive care to the displaced people at the centre and the neighbouring community. Services included medical diagnostics, psychological counselling, free medicines, and follow-up care for

women, children, and chronic patients.

No one was forgotten, even the private needs of women were covered. Behind every tent, there was hurt and behind every case, there was a story, but above all, more than 700 people were able to find a moment of comfort, medicine, and a smile.

This field clinic was an act of love, and a step on a long road of giving.

The New Halfa Youth Emergency Room continues. As long as there are people in need, there are young people standing up.

# 750 thousand displaced people: Tawila drowns in the misery of tents under the autumn rains

North Darfur-Tawila - June 2025

750,000 IDPs in Tawila face autumn without shelter, in light of the worsening humanitarian crisis in Sudan, IDPs in various displacement camps in Tawila, North Darfur, face very harsh living conditions, which worsen with the arrival of the autumn season and the rains. These huge numbers of IDPs, who fled the ongoing conflict, lack basic shelter and basic necessities, which threatens their lives and increases their daily suffering. The displaced people in Tawila live in dire humanitarian conditions, lacking proper shelter, which are limited to straw or old used clothes, which makes them directly exposed to the harsh weather conditions. With the onset of the rainy season, this suffering is exacerbated, as there are not enough tents or tarps to protect families from the rains that autumn in the region. This acute shortage of shelter materials leaves thousands of IDPs virtually unprotected, exposed to waterborne diseases and other health risks associated with living in an unsanitary and exposed environment.

**Urgent appeal to save the displaced**

In light of these tragic circumstances, the Tawila Emergency Room launched an urgent appeal to provide tents and tarps for the displaced, emphasising the need for immediate intervention to save them from the danger of heavy rains. The ERR appealed to all humanitarian organisations and concerned parties to provide urgent assistance to these afflicted people who are facing a very harsh life. This situation requires an urgent and coordinated humanitarian response from international and local organisations, as well as government agencies, to intensify their efforts to provide shelter, food, water and health care to the displaced. Ignoring this crisis will jeopardise the lives of hundreds of thousands, especially as the rains continue and living conditions deteriorate. The top priority must be to protect these vulnerable people and alleviate their suffering. This appeal comes at a time when reports indicate that large numbers of people have been displaced from El Fasher, Zamzam and Abu Shouk camps to Tawila, increasing pressure on scarce resources.



# Abu Shouk: Cries of hunger and despair.. Displaced people face a slow death in the silence of the world.

North Darfur, El Fasher - June 2025

In light of the deteriorating humanitarian conditions of the displaced people in Abu Shouk camp, north of El Fasher, the initiative to launch a communal kitchen came as a glimmer of hope to alleviate the burden of hunger and suffering. The Abu Shouk Camp Emergency Room was able to launch this essential project, which targets 100 displaced families, approximately 600 to 700 individuals, for seven consecutive days, at a total cost of 9 million Sudanese pounds. This step is necessary and vital in light of the acute shortage of food, medicine and potable water suffered by the IDPs in the camp. The IDPs in Abu Shouk are living in extremely harsh conditions, whose suffering is exacerbated by the ongoing conflict and the neglect that has affected them. Children, women and the elderly

are the most affected, suffering from malnutrition and diseases as a result of the lack of basic needs. The Abu Shouk Camp Emergency Room emphasises that this initiative is only a temporary solution in the face of a deep-rooted humanitarian crisis. Therefore, it makes an urgent appeal to all international humanitarian agencies and organisations to intervene immediately and provide the necessary support. Support is urgently needed to ensure the sustainable provision of food, medicine and clean drinking water to IDPs. The situation in Abu Shouk is not just numbers and statistics; it is the painful human stories of families who have lost everything and are looking for a glimpse of hope for a better tomorrow. Will international voices respond to Abu Shouk's cry before it is too late?





## Karnoi Emergency Room launches food basket distribution project



24 June 2025

In light of the difficult humanitarian situation in the city of Karnoi, where events are accelerating and human suffering is worsening, the Karnoi Emergency Room launched a food basket distribution project at the primary school shelter. This project targets 100 families of displaced people who fled the areas of Tawila, El Fasher and Zamzam in search of safety and stability. This step comes within the framework of the emergency response projects to alleviate the humanitarian suffering experienced by citizens affected by the war that started on 15 April 2023. The displaced people face great challenges in securing their basic needs, and the ERR is working hard to provide support and assistance. The ERR works in collaboration

with supporting agencies and organisations to provide urgent emergency services. The Karnoi Emergency Room thanks its partners for supporting humanitarian projects. In addition, volunteers play an important role in providing psychological and moral support to the displaced, bringing smiles, hope and encouragement. These efforts enhance the spirit of solidarity and solidarity among community members. The ERR intends to expand the scope of the project to include the largest possible number of needy and displaced people in Karnoi locality, to provide urgent ambulatory services, empower the displaced and provide their basic needs.

# Awareness campaigns to combat cholera epidemic in El Daein city

22 June 2025

Under complex humanitarian conditions, and with the spread of the cholera epidemic in East Darfur State, especially the city of Al-Daein, which includes the main isolation centre of the epidemic, the health situation is worsening with the recording of dozens of deaths, including displaced people living in fragile conditions. The outbreak comes at a time when the health sector is suffering from an acute shortage of medicines and a significant lack of resources, which has increased the state of fear and anxiety among citizens and IDPs in the city.

In response to this emergency situation, on Sunday, June 22, the Al Muhajer Humanitarian Emergency Room launched a cholera awareness and education campaign, which began its activities at the Al Muhajer Health Centre

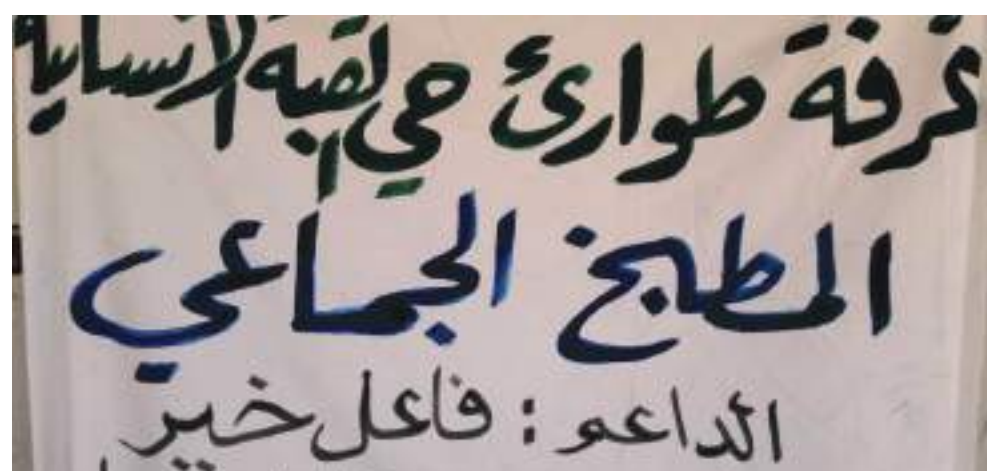
in Al Kalik and the displaced persons' shelter at Abu Bakr Al Siddiq School. On its first day, the campaign included direct awareness sessions, health tips and advice aimed at raising awareness of ways to prevent the disease, especially in light of the difficult living and health conditions. The awareness campaigns are scheduled to continue for a week, targeting IDP centres, markets and public gathering places, with the participation of a number of volunteers and the support of ERR members through subscriptions and individual contributions. This initiative comes at a critical time, as the local health system suffers from a very weak response, making these community efforts a necessary and important step to protect lives and limit the spread of the pandemic.

## Communal kitchen initiative for displaced people at Al-Nazir Madbo School - Al-Daein City

4 June 2025

In light of the harsh humanitarian conditions in the city of El Daein, especially within the displacement camps, the Al Qubba humanitarian Emergency Room implemented an urgent initiative to establish a communal kitchen on 4 June 2025, which lasted for a week, aiming to provide integrated food meals for the displaced people residing in Al Nazir Madbo School, which has turned into a shelter for dozens of families affected by the conflict. This initiative came with the direct support of philanthropists and volunteers, at a time when East Darfur is witnessing an almost complete cessation of communal kitchens, which exacerbated the food security crisis, especially among children suffering from acute malnutrition and chronic hunger. During its period of operation, the communal kitchen has contributed to alleviating the suffering of

hundreds of displaced children, women and the elderly, and has clearly contributed to reducing the manifestations of hunger and nutritional vulnerability, and creating an atmosphere of community solidarity and humanitarian solidarity in a challenging environment. The Al-Qubba Humanitarian Emergency Room calls on all local and international humanitarian and relief agencies to support this important humanitarian initiative and work to expand the scope of the communal kitchen to include other camps and displacement centres. The emergency room renews its full commitment to humanitarian work in order to alleviate the suffering of those affected by conflicts, and calls for strengthening cooperation and community and humanitarian solidarity to ensure human dignity and the inherent right to life and food.



# Iftar and Adahi meat distributed to IDPs in Um Jack area

8 June 2025

Babanusa Emergency Room implemented a humanitarian programme on the occasion of Eid Al-Adha, which included serving Iftar meal and distributing sacrificial meat to IDPs residing in shelters in Um Jack area. The programme aims to alleviate the suffering of those affected by the humanitarian situation, promote the values of social

solidarity, and share the joy of Eid with the displaced despite the difficult circumstances. The ERR confirmed that it will continue to implement more service and humanitarian initiatives to support affected families and displaced people, as part of the emergency rooms' ongoing efforts to respond to crises.



## The “Tokkul” Initiative continues for the 131st day in West Kordofan

22 June 2025

There's no sadness here, only heroes. We carry strength in our hearts, and hope burns bright within us.

As part of the Babanusa Emergency Room initiative to alleviate the suffering of the citizens of Babanusa city, its countryside, administrative units and villages, who were affected by the hell of war and were forced to be displaced, leaving behind their homes and everything they own. In continuation of the 131st day of the Babanousa Emergency Room's Tawakkul initiative in the village

of Um Jak, the ERR implemented the Um Jakk (2) joint kitchen project, which is a joint kitchen for the displaced people of Babanousa city through which an Iftar meal is served to the displaced people. In this regard, the ERR family extends its thanks and appreciation to all volunteer cadres and donors, while wishing everyone good health and well-being and that God blesses our Sudan with security, peace and stability





## Launching a project to support the dialysis centre at Al-Muglad Referential Hospital

June 2025

In light of the critical humanitarian situation and the increasing suffering of kidney failure patients, and in order to provide direct support to the health sector, the Emergency and Construction ERR in Al-Muglad locality launched a project to provide dialysis machines at the Dialysis Centre in Al-Muglad Referential Hospital, with direct support that included:

- Two dialysis machines from "Fresenius"
- One dialysis machine from "Ganbro/Baxter"

This urgent intervention comes in response to the urgent need that the centre is going through, especially after

the failure of (4) of the dialysis machines, which made the centre work with only one machine, which does not cover the increasing needs of patients and does not guarantee the continuation of providing the necessary medical service to save lives. We at the Emergency and Construction ERR believe that the right to treatment is one of the most basic human rights, and we are fully aware of the challenges faced by patients and their families in light of the war and the collapse of the health system, so this initiative was a humanitarian and moral duty that must be undertaken, and we affirm our full commitment to continue our efforts.

## Cholera reaches Abu zabad, one person dies and nine confirmed cases

24 June 2025

Dr. Al-Amin Abdullah, Medical Director of Abu zabad Hospital, announced the first cases of cholera in the city, confirming the death of one person and the arrival of nine confirmed cases to the hospital over the past two days. Dr. Al-Amin explained that all the cases registered so far have come from only one neighbourhood within Abu zabad city, raising fears that the disease will spread to other neighbourhoods and areas if urgent intervention

is not taken. He lamented the acute shortage of medical supplies needed to address and contain the epidemic, stressing the importance of concerted efforts to prevent the health situation from worsening. For its part, the Abu zabad Emergency Room appealed to all partners and health organisations to intervene quickly and provide the necessary support, noting the need to take urgent steps to prevent the spread of the disease to neighbouring areas.



## An urgent call for action from the emergency and construction rooms - West Kordofan State

25 June 2025

To all health authorities and humanitarian and relief organisations

**Location:** Abu zabad Hospital - West Kordofan State

In light of the deteriorating health situation in the isolation centre at Abu zabad Hospital and amid increasing cases of cholera, we launch this urgent appeal to support the hospital immediately and urgently with intravenous solutions and life-saving medicines.

**Epidemiological situation today - Isolation Centre, Abouzabad Hospital:**

Number of confirmed cases inside the hospital: 13 cases

**Number of deaths as of today:** 4 deaths

We emphasise that the continued shortage of medicines and medical solutions will lead to a catastrophic deterioration of the situation and put the lives of citizens

in direct danger.

# Cholera Awareness and Vaccination Campaign in Old Omdurman

19 June 2025

In light of the spread of cholera and out of concern for the safety of the community, the Old Omdurman Emergency Room, in coordination with the Humanitarian Organisation for Peace and Environmental Development, and in partnership with the Ministry of Health, implemented a health awareness and vaccination campaign through Tkiyet Al-Sharafiya - West. The campaign aimed to raise community awareness of the importance of preventing cholera, and included the following activities: Awareness lectures on ways of transmission and prevention, distribution of soap to encourage personal hygiene behaviours, vaccination of more

than 300 families with the cholera vaccine, and distribution of meals to attendees.

The Chamber called on all citizens and residents in Old Omdurman and all of Khartoum State to hurry up to receive the free cholera vaccine, which is safe and effective and provides protection for several years, and warned of the need to adhere to health precautions, most importantly hand washing and cooking food thoroughly. Your health is your responsibility. The vaccine is a protection for you and your family.



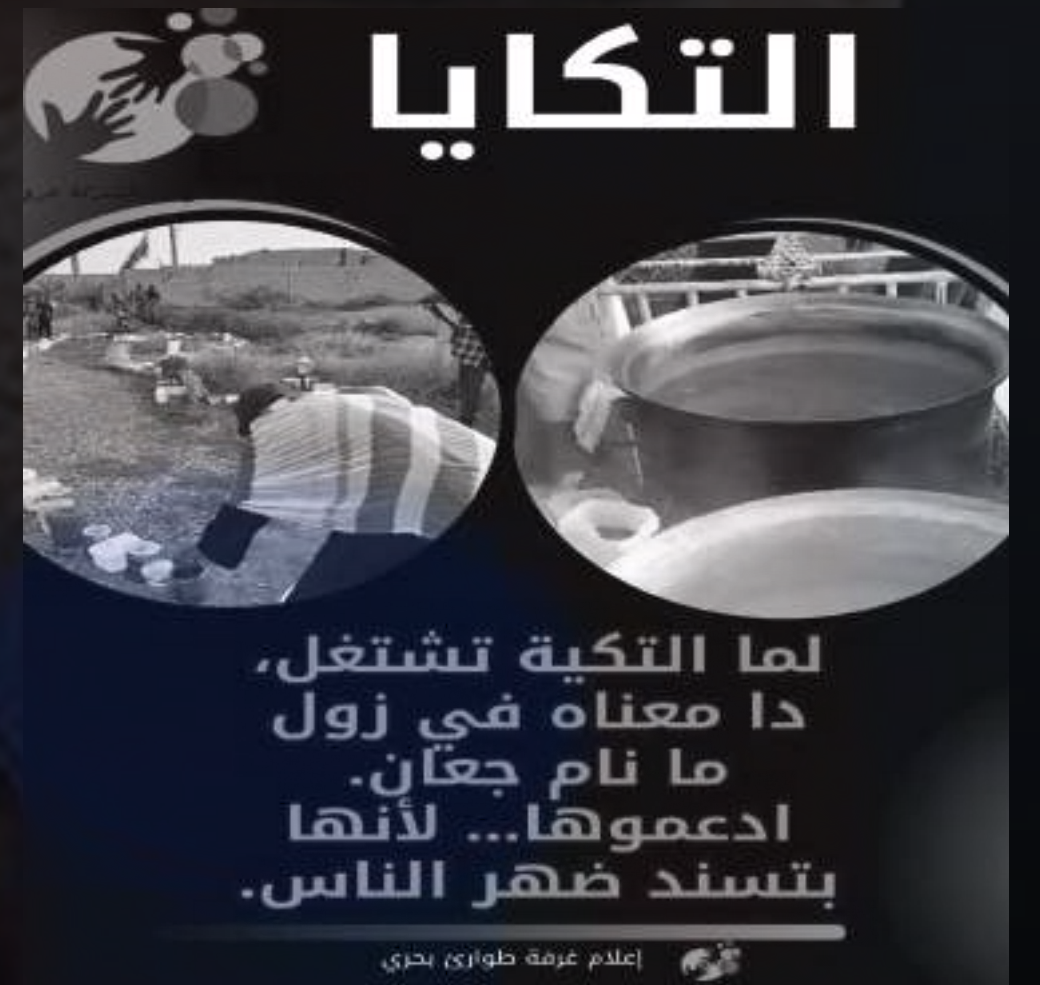


# Bahri City Takaya has stopped working

11 June 2025

Throughout previous periods of crisis, takayas represented a pivotal means of community solidarity, as they contributed to filling the daily food gap for thousands of families affected by conflict and displacement.
